Presentations and Presenters

Breakout Session #1 Workshop Choices -- 9:45-10:30AM

Session A Title: A Deep Dive into Developing Your Chapter Revitalization Action Plan Session Description: CTSO Chapter Revitalization planning groups are encouraged to attend this 45-minute session which will review the need to increase the number of members; to mentor and retain members; and to grow new leaders at the chapter, state and international levels of DKG. We will review the DKG CTSO Revitalization Plan and offer some new resources, which will be shared statewide at a later date. Finally, chapter representatives will have the opportunity to share great ideas and best practices and to ask any questions as each chapter works on their Revitalization Action Plan. The session will be conducted by Pam Aubin, CTSO Treasurer and Ann Grosjean, CTSO Membership Chair.

Session Presenters: Ann Grosjean & Pam Aubin

Length of Session: 45 minutes Materials needed (at home): None

About the presenters: Pam Aubin was the Connecticut State Organization Membership Chair from 2021-2023 and is now the CTSO Treasurer. She is currently in her 4th year as Theta Chapter President. Pam's professional career began as an elementary teacher and administrator for 27 years. She taught at Annie E. Vinton Elementary School in Mansfield, CT for 10 years followed by several administrative positions in Norwich Public Schools including: Principal of John Moriarty Elementary School, Norwich Public Schools Director of Curriculum and Instruction, then as Superintendent of Schools in Norwich, CT and Montville, CT. She received her B.S. in Elementary Education from Eastern Connecticut State University and Masters in Early Childhood Education. She also earned her 6th year in Intermediate Supervision (092) and Certificate in Executive Leadership (Superintendent-093) from the University of Connecticut.

Ann Grosjean is the CTSO Immediate Past President and presently serves as CTSO Membership Chair. Ann has been a member of Theta Chapter, CTSO and DKG for thirty-eight years. A retired elementary teacher, Ann taught for a total of thirty-five years – three years of first grade in New Jersey followed by thirty-two in Mansfield, CT, where she taught gifted and talented and later first grade. Ann attended the Dunbarton College of the Holy Cross in Washington DC and William Paterson College in Wayne, NJ, for her undergraduate elementary education degree. She later earned her MA in Gifted Education, Sixth Year in Educational Leadership and PhD in Educational Psychology at the University of Connecticut.

Session B Title: Books That Sing; Books That Dance

Sing with books? Dance with books? With me? With my kids?

Yep! Yes! Sure! Why not?!

Session Description: Tell me, I forget. Show me, I remember. Involve me.....I understand.

Open a book and what do you see? Words? Pictures? Look again. Is there an opportunity to sing? An opportunity to move? If so, invite your students to do more than just listen. Involve them; make their learning more meaningful by inviting them to sing and move right along. This lively session will share books that use "music" to help make authentic connections to other dimensions of their learning, and other cultures. Many of these selections may also be used as "Brain Breaks," moments to refocus, reorganize and reenergize the brain.

Session Presenter: Lillie Feierabend

Length of Session: 45 minutes

Materials needed (at home): None; a list of books that invite active participation will be provided.

About the presenter: Lillie Feierabend is known for her work with young children and instilling a love of music within them. She has been an early childhood and general music educator for over thirty years and a conductor for the Connecticut Children's Chorus for seventeen. She has twice been honored with her district's Teacher of the Year Award and in 2008 also received the Outstanding Elementary Music Educator Award from the Connecticut Music Educators Association. She is a frequent clinician at local, state, national and international conferences, presenting over three hundred lively and thought-provoking sessions on music and movement development. Over the course of her career, Lillie has mentored twenty-three student teachers and will forever be grateful for the opportunity.

Session C Title: A Child's Right to Choose What They Read

Session Description: With so much talk about inclusive texts and book banning this workshop is designed as a starting point for discussion. During this workshop, we'll look at some resources and examples of inclusive books.

Session Presenters: Jackie Abbott & Pat O'Connell Buckley

Length of Session: 45 minutes

About the presenters: Jackie and Pat, members of Theta Chapter, are both past CTSO Presidents and serve on the Curriculum of Hope for a Peaceful World Committee. Jackie and Pat have led pervious book discussion groups at CTSO fall conferences.

Jackie taught for 29 years at Eastern Connecticut State University where she was chair of the Education Department. Prior to Eastern, Jackie taught elementary school in New Hampshire and the country of Turkey. Jackie lives on Lower Bolton Lake, enjoys spending time with her son and grandson, reading, volunteering, and serving on the Manchester Peace and Justice Committee.

Pat is retired from the Mansfield Public Schools where she taught at the elementary level for 34 years. Pat lives on Middle Bolton Lake and enjoys spending time with her three grandchildren.

Session D Title: Girls' Interest and Achievement in Math: Action Research and Possible Solutions Session Description: A female's college and career goals may ultimately be restricted by declining interest and achievement in mathematics that originates during her pre-high school years. Linda examined how a piloted pre-engineering program in one eighth grade middle school team impacted adolescent girls' interest and achievement in mathematics. The results suggested that a program called Project Lead The Way (PLTW) positively impacted both girls' interest and achievement in mathematics. The question is: Must we invest in costly programs to address the needs of our female students? What else can we do to encourage the girls in our lives to love and pursue careers in the STEM subjects? What works in your math (and science) classrooms, regardless of the grade level you teach?

Session Presenter: **Linda Paslov** Length of Session: 45 minutes

Materials needed (at home): Be prepared to share ideas and success stories for making math (and science) more appealing to our girls, at all levels.

About the presenter: Linda Paslov is the CTSO First Vice President, Educational Excellence Chair, and Fine Arts Chair, as well as the treasurer and membership chair (and immediate past president) of Beta Chapter. She completed her BS in Elementary Education, MS in Reading, and secondary math certification at the University of Bridgeport, and her 092 coursework and Ed.D. from SCSU. Linda contends that she uses both sides of her brain equally. Retired twice, after working in both the K-12 and higher education arenas in teaching and leadership roles (she was both a math teacher and reading consultant at Central High School in Bridgeport; a high school assistant principal and middle school principal in Stratford; the Director of Curriculum, Instruction, and Assessments for the Trumbull Public Schools; an adjunct professor in Educational Leadership at SCSU; and an assistant professor turned Director of the School of Education at UB), Linda currently serves as the Director of the Trumbull Agriscience and Biotechnology Center. With the help of the right side of her brain, she has had several poems published in the DKG Fine Arts Gallery, and has won first and second place nationally for two poems she wrote for the DAR American Heritage Committee Contest, as well as second place for a song. In addition, Linda has had two articles published in the DKG Bulletin: Collegial Exchange. She was also featured in the DKG blog "Artist Spotlight" on August 16, 2021, along with her poem, "Teaching Is..." Mother of three adult daughters (two of whom are DKG members), wife to Joe, and GrammaLinda to Abby Rose (age 5), Linda enjoys writing poetry and articles, sewing, drawing, baking, singing, genealogy, and all animals, especially her dog, Schroeder, and rabbit, Javier Bartholomew.
