Denise was elected president of the National Association of Secretaries of State for 2016-2017. She serves on the Board of Advisors to the U.S. Election Assistance Commission. She has also launched an award-winning online business startup tool and led the development of Connecticut's e-Regulations System, an online platform to update agency regulations.

Prior to her election as Secretary of State, Denise served 17 years as a State Representative from the 54th District of Mansfield and Chaplin. She was a member of Government Administration and Elections Committee from 1995-1997; vice-chair of the Education Committee from 1994-1999; chair of Appropriations from 2005-2009 and House Majority Leader from 2009-2011. In 2009, she was named "Most Respected by the Other Side of the Aisle" and "Most Effective Legislator".

Prior to being a State Legislator, Denise served on the Mansfield Board of Education. She is a graduate of the University of Connecticut and is a classically trained pianist. She lives in Hartford. Denise's family includes her husband, Dr. Stephen Leach, his two sons, her three children and five grandchildren.

Alma Collins was a DKG member for 60 years. She was valedictorian of her class at Norwich Free Academy and a Phi Beta Kappa graduate of Connecticut College of Women, where she was president of the College Press Board. She received a Master's Degree in English at Trinity College and completed a sixth year at Boston University and the University of Connecticut for national certification as a secondary school counselor. She is listed in *Who's Who America* and *Who's Who in the World*. Her book *Danielle at the Wadsworth*, published in 2004, was dedicated to her beloved husband Daniel Francis Collins.

Following her 25 year career as a teacher and counselor at Hall High School and Conard High School in West Hartford, she wrote art-related articles for numerous national magazines, including *Architectural Digest, Connoisseur, House Beautiful, Colonial Homes, Home Decorating* and *Antiques Journal with Architectural Digest* cover stories translated into Japanese and Italian editions. As President of Arts Universal Research Associates, she represented many artists and worked with several international companies in promotional work and publication, as well as in finding artists for specific company projects. Her recorded interview with Salvador Dali is included in the archives of the Wadsworth Athenaeum Museum of Art.

Rosa Jennings, Epsilon Chapter May 12, 2017



Rosa Jennings was a member of DKG for 41 years. She received a bachelor's degree from Southern Connecticut State University, a master's degree from Columbia University and her sixth year degree from the University of Connecticut. She was a teacher and guidance counselor in the Hartford Public Schools. Rosa played the trumpet, violin and piano; and she was a former member of the Salvation Army Band in New Haven. 
Doris Charter, Rho Chapter January 3, 2018

Our world is experiencing the greatest refugee crisis since World War II. People are finding it necessary to escape their home countries because of war, human rights violations, famine or due to climate change or weather episodes making their homes and communities uninhabitable. Working with the United Nations and the U.S. Immigration Services, some refugees are fortunate to be able to settle in the United States after a nearly two year strenuous vetting process. A major step in the resettlement process involves the nine agencies who work with the U.S. Immigration Service after the selection process to arrange for refugees to arrive in their assigned region of the United States. If a family is assigned to Connecticut, it might be placed with IRIS which works closely with local community co-sponsorship groups. Connecticut is blessed to be able to work within these local support groups to host these families in our communities after they have arrived through

For the past 12 years, Chris George has been the Executive Director of IRIS, the New Haven-based refugee resettlement agency that has welcomed more than 1,000 refugees to Connecticut over the last three years. Chris has spent most of his professional life living in, or working on, the Middle East. Before returning to Connecticut in 2004, he worked seven years in the West Bank and Gaza Strip. Chris directed a legislative strengthening project with the Palestinian Parliament and later established an emergency assistance program for Palestinian nonprofits. From 1994 to 1996, Chris was Executive Director of Human Rights Watch - Middle East. Prior to that, he worked with Save the Children for nine years (mostly in the West Bank and Gaza) and three years with American Friends Service Committee (mostly in Lebanon). Chris began his international career in 1977 as a Peace Corps Volunteer in Muscat, Oman. Altogether, he spent close to 20 years living in the Middle East. Chris speaks Arabic, has a BA in History from the University of Pennsylvania and is a graduate of Montclair High School in New Jersey.


